Aims of Scheme

MAIN OBJECTIVE

 Meet Irelands commitments in relation to carbon emissions reductions and energy reductions targets for 2020

SECONDARY OBJECTIVES

- Stimulate employment generation
- Improve energy efficiency of the household
- Reduce the amount of expenditure on energy
- Improve health and wellbeing



The Programme is implemented in 2 Phases:

Phase 1: Attic Insulation/Cavity Wall Insulation (Shallow Retrofit)

Phase 2: Focuses on fabric upgrades to dwellings with solid/hollow block wall construction and includes the provision of heating upgrades (Deep retrofit)

Rollout

- PHASE 1 NEARLY COMPLETE IN ALL LOCAL AUTHORITIES
- FULL ROLLOUT OF PHASE 2 IS CURRENTLY UNDERWAY CIRCULAR ISSUED IN MARCH THIS YEAR FOLLOWED BY ALLOCATIONS IN JULY
- TO DATE OVER 70,000 UNITS RETROFITTED WITH EXPENDITURE OF APPROX. €130M (INCLUDES BOTH PHASE 1& PHASE 2)
- €25M ALLOCATED IN TOTAL FOR 2019





Co-funding

► Energy Efficiency works carried out under Phase 2 of the Energy Efficiency Upgrade Programme are eligible for 50% co-funding under the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) 2014-2020 operational programmes.

Claiming Arrangements

- ► Each claim under Phase 2 must include the following:
 - ► Signed claim form;
 - ▶ Pre and Post-BER Details;
 - ▶ Claims should be submitted as soon as possible, but no later than end November 2019.

ERDF Compliance

- ▶ DHPLG is obliged to carry out both <u>desktop</u> and <u>on-site verification</u> <u>checks</u> on expenditure under the programmes, in line with Article 126 of Regulation (EU) 1303 of 2013.
- An ERDF Monitoring and Audit Unit has been established in the Department to commence these checks
- ▶ These checks focus on procurement and expenditure.
- Checks have commenced and each LA will be visited at least once over the lifetime of the programme
